- Mining Plans
 - "We did not dictate this plan. We approve plans, we don't say what goes in them."

Plan Disputes

- ▶ Applicable Scenarios
 - New Plan Dispute
 - Existing Approved Plan
 - Operator Proposed Change
- ▶ Plan Revocation Proceedings



"Bishop Procedure"

Mandatory

Written Notification

Second Written Notification

▶ Revocation of Plan / Citation



Problematic Scenarios

▶ Single Sample Demand Letter

Condition for Abatement



The Demand Letter

Typical letter

No potential for enforcement action

Aggressive



What do you do?

First: Cover yourself

▶ Second: Try diplomacy

▶ Third: Weigh your options

▶ Fourth: Exercise your rights
